**GRAFTING ROSES** – 75 Slides – by Frank and Gertrude Hirsh

This program shows the methods and techniques that were successfully used in Florida by the Hirsh's in grafting rose stems to rootstock.

**GROWING ROSES AS BONSAI** – 38 Slides – by Itami Rose Nursery, Japan and Mr. Akira Atombi, Japanese Rose Society

The art of extracting the beauty of a plant in nature within a limited space. Originating in ancient times it is highly valued in Japan and China as an art, to express the beauty of nature in a pot or planting tray. The practice of Bonsai has become widespread in Europe and America together with Ikebana, that is Japanese style flower arrangement. On this basis of these two arts, there is a desire to show the effect of nature on the plant. It is this point, not a mere mechanical hobby that attracts many people. In this art there are no limits to what may be achieved. Japanese rosarians have applied the skills of Bonsai to the Modern miniature roses. Presently, because of the strong floriferous and recurrent habit and the size of the plant, miniature roses including climbing types are used as Bonsai.

These slides depict the process of hybridizing. Excellent photography.

**HOW YOU SPRAY DOES MAKE A DIFFERENCE** – 67 Slides

Illustrates how to spray ornamentals, trees and weeds with a compression sprayer. Also illustrates how to spray materials, and thus protect the environment. The use of proper materials to combat disease and insects is also shown.

**HYBRIDIZING OF ROSES** – 47 Slides - by Dr. A. Michael Dykstra

This program depicts a simple approach to rose hybridizing and should be a popular program. Dr. Dykstra presents a good program on yet another aspect of rose growing – the exciting and challenging task of hybridizing.
